COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Election of two new council members will be held at the congregational meeting on January 26th. There are two seats to fill and we have two candidates: Marilou Doughty and Emma Birkmire. Emma is currently a council member and is seeking reelection. The nominating committee did its due diligence to find two additional candidates but were unsuccessful even after asking many members. The ballot will have a space for a write-in candidate if anyone who is qualified would like to nominate themselves. Below is some information about each candidate.

ADULT FAITH FORMATION

We began a new year of Bible discussion by reflecting on Five Key Lutheran Principles:

1. Law and Gospel. Lutherans say that the Word of God speaks both law and gospel and that both must be held together for God's word to be fulfilled. The law is that which accuses and judges us; the gospel is that which comforts us and saves us.

2. What Shows Forth Christ. Lutherans say the Bible is the Word of God and reveals Jesus Christ to us. Lutherans are a Jesus people and they understand the Bible to be a Jesus book.

3. Scripture Interprets Scripture. Lutherans believe that difficult passages of Scripture are to be interpreted in light of those passages that are more readily understandable, and all of Scripture is to be interpreted in light of the Bible's central themes. Example: Historically, single verses were used to justify slavery, however, a central theme of Scripture is that God does not want His people to live in bondage.

4. The Plain Meaning of the Text. This means that
